
### **COVID-19 Resources**

### **Drugged Driving -- What You Should Know**

In 2016, 44 percent of drivers in fatal car crashes (with known results) tested positive for drugs, according to the report entitled <u>"Drug-Impaired Driving: Marijuana and</u> <u>Opioids Raise Critical Issues for States"</u> by the Governors Highway Safety Association. This is up from 28 percent in 2006 (a number we know has increased again in the last four years by reviewing local crash statistics from 2016-2020 in Butler County and Ohio).
